InvestNJ and Main Street Assistance Program Signed into Law

During the month of December, Governor Corzine signed several bills into law that he hopes will stimulate New Jersey's economy and provide assistance to businesses.

On December 10, the InvestNJ Business Grant Program was signed into law. This program, which will be administered by the New Jersey Economic Development Authority (EDA), was a part of the Governor's Economic Assistance and Recovery Program proposed in October.

InvestNJ has both a capital investment grant component and a job creation grant component. The investment grant component makes available up to \$70 million through an appropriation to the EDA for capital investment grants, of which up to \$50 million will be allocated for investment grants for capital investments involving expenses for the site preparation and construction, renovation, improvement or equipping a newly constructed, renovated or improved building. Additionally, \$20 million will be allocated for obtaining and installing fixtures and machinery, apparatus or equipment in a building.

The investment grant component will also provide an incentive to businesses encouraging capital investments by awarding grants of up to seven percent of the qualifying capital investment of at least \$5,000 made by a business in New Jersey during the period prior to January 1, 2011. These grants will provide businesses with the equip-

ment of the State sales tax that may be paid on their capital investment expenses.

The job creation grant component of InvestNJ will provide an incentive to qualified businesses that have operated continuously in this State for at least two years to create full-time jobs that provide health benefit coverage and that are retained for at least one year. This incentive makes each position created eligible for a \$3,000 grant to the qualified businesses if the business has experienced a net increase in employment of eligible positions during the same 12 consecutive months.

Additionally on December 16, at the invitation of the Governor, the Chamber attended Governor Corzine's bill signing ceremony for the Main Street Business Assistance Program. This program, which will be administered by the New Jersey Economic Development Authority (EDA), was also a part of the Governor's Economic Assistance and Recovery Program proposed in October.

The Main Street Business Assistance Program will enable qualified small and mid-size companies and nonprofit organizations in New Jersey to access capital. Developed in partnership with the departments of Banking and Insurance and Treasury and the state's banking community, the Main Street Business Assistance Program will be funded by a \$50-million State appropriation and administered by the EDA.

The program will have two components:

a loan participation and/or guarantee that will be offered by the EDA through participating banks, and a line of credit guarantee offered through the EDA's 13 Preferred Lender Partners. To qualify, borrowers must be in business for at least two years, maintain jobs in New Jersey and meet other EDA eligibility requirements.

UEZ Enhancement Bill Signed Into Law

On December 17, Governor Corzine signed **A-2720 (Vas/BURZICHELLI/POU)** into law, which broadens the small qualified business exception under UEZ sales tax rebate program. Past law allows small business having up to \$3 million in gross receipts to receive the point sale sales tax exemption. This new law would expand that definition to small businesses that have up to \$7 million in gross receipts.

UEZs were established in 1984 to encourage businesses to stay in urban areas so that they can provide jobs, and promote and protect the historical manufacturing base of our state. Although the Chamber believes that all businesses in UEZ zones should not be required to pay sales tax on purchases up front, we believe this enhancement to the program is a step in the right direction. ✨
