## Invest NJ and Main Street Assistance Program

### Applications Available

Applications are now available for the two new business assistance programs proposed by Governor Corzine as a part of the Governor's Economic Assistance and Recovery Program this past October.

### Invest NJ Business Grant Program

Invest NJ has both a capital investment grant component and a job creation grant component. The investment grant component makes available up to \$70 million through an appropriation to the New Jersey Economic Development Authority (NJEDA) for capital investment grants, of which up to \$50 million will be allocated for investment grants for capital investments involving expenses for the site preparation and construction, renovation, improvement or equipping a newly constructed, renovated or improved building. Additionally, \$20 million will be allocated for obtaining and installing fixtures and machinery, apparatus or equipment in a building.

The investment grant component will also provide an incentive to businesses encouraging capital investments by awarding grants of up to seven percent of the qualifying capital investment of at least \$5,000 made by a business in New Jersey during the period prior to January 1, 2011. These grants will provide businesses with the equivalent of the State sales tax that may be paid on their capital investment expenses.

The job creation grant component of Invest NJ will provide an incentive to qualified businesses that have operated

continuously in this State for at least two years to create full-time jobs that provide health benefit coverage and that are retained for at least one year. This incentive makes each position created eligible for a \$3,000 grant to the qualified businesses if the business has experienced a net increase in employment of eligible positions during the same 12 consecutive months.

### Main Street Business Assistance Program

The Main Street Business Assistance Program enables qualified small and mid-size companies and nonprofit organizations in New Jersey to access capital. Developed in partnership with the departments of Banking and Insurance and Treasury and the State's banking community, the Main Street Business Assistance Program will be funded by a \$50 million State appropriation and administered by the NJEDA.

The program has two components: a loan participation and/or guarantee that is offered by the NJEDA through participating banks, and a line of credit guarantee offered through the NJEDA's 13 Preferred Lender Partners.

According to the NJEDA's press release, for fixed assets such as buildings and equipment, the NJEDA will provide a maximum participation of 25 percent, not to exceed \$1 million, and a maximum bank loan guarantee of 50 percent, up to \$2 million. For working capital loans to cover operating expenses, the NJEDA will provide up to 25 percent of a bank loan, not to exceed \$750,000, and a maximum

guarantee of 50 percent, up to \$1.5 million.

The interest rate on NJEDA loans will be fixed at five percent for a maximum of five years. Borrowers will also be able to use the Main Street program to refinance higher-interest debt. The line of credit guarantee, which may also cover fixed assets or working capital, will be set at a maximum of 50 percent of the bank amount, up to a maximum of \$250,000.

To qualify, borrowers must be in business for at least two years, maintain jobs in New Jersey and meet other NJEDA eligibility requirements. Go to the NJEDA website at [www.njeda.com](http://www.njeda.com) and click on the "Applications" tab. The toll free help line at the NJEDA is 1-800-537-7397.

The Chamber was proud to support both of these programs, which we believe will provide a much needed stimulus to the business community, as employment numbers continue to drop, access to capital is limited and the overall economic climate continues to decline.

### UI Fund Dangerously Low as NJ's Unemployment Rate Jumps

Recently, the New Jersey Department of Labor and Workforce Development released data, which showed that New Jersey's unemployment rate hit its highest level last month in nearly 15 years jumping to 7.1 percent bringing the total number of jobs lost in November and December to 33,700. Most of these jobs were lost in the retail, construction and professional and business services.

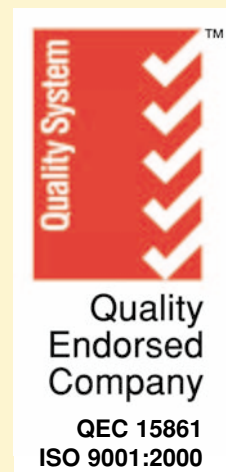

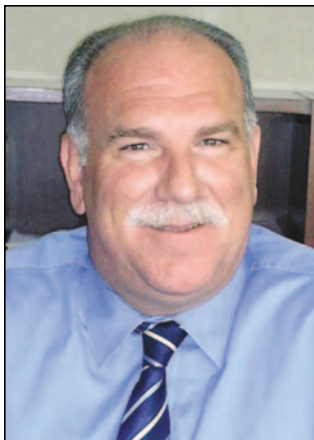

This spike in unemployment has further strained an already low unemployment insurance (UI) trust fund. According to NJ Department of Labor Commissioner David Socolow, the current level of the UI is \$400 million, which is enough to cover 10 weeks of unemployment payments. Originally, the UI Fund was designed to be forward-funded, building up surpluses during strong economic times to carry it through down periods of the business cycle, such as the one we are experiencing today. However, since 1993, approximately \$4.7 billion in employer and employee tax contributions to the UI Fund have been diverted to fund other programs and balance the State budget over the objections and admonitions of our Chamber.

Over the years, the Chamber has voiced its concerns over the practice of diverting money from the UI fund when it is healthy, and the impact these diversions would have upon the fund balance when the fund needs the money most, such as in today's recession. If the UI fund dips below a certain dollar amount, an automatic payroll tax - that could be as much as \$700 million - will automatically go into effect.

Governor Corzine is counting on an infusion of federal dollars to replenish the State's dwindling UI fund. However, if the State does not receive federal assistance, it is doubtful that the tax hike could be avoided.

## Moratorium on Developer Fees Moves Forward

On January 26, the Senate Economic Growth Committee considered **S-2485 (LESNIAK/WHELAN)**, which would grant an 18-month moratorium on a 2.5 percent fee on construction projects. This fee was part of a measure signed into law in July 2008 that imposed a 2.5 percent fee on commercial and industrial projects in order to fund affordable housing obligations. Additionally, S-2485 (Lesniak/Whelan) entirely exempts from the 2.5 percent fee projects that received site approvals prior to the July 2008 bill signing, or have an "inherently beneficial use," such as schools and hospitals.

The Chamber believes the suspension of the 2.5 percent fee will help encourage economic development at a time when New Jersey's economy is at a steep decline. S-2485 (Lesniak/Whelan) passed through committee by a vote of four to zero, with one abstention, and now moves to the Senate Budget and Appropriations Committee for consideration. ✨

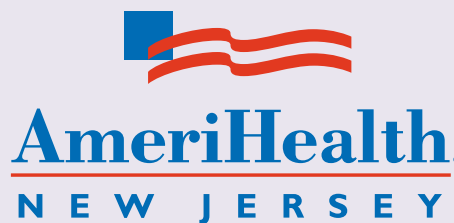
