## LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

### Chamber Supports Regulatory Flexibility Act

During yesterday's voting session, the Chamber submitted a position of support to the General Assembly regarding **A-2129 (Chivukula/McHose)**, which would expand the scope of the New Jersey Regulatory Flexibility Act to include the impact of rules on small businesses.

In the past, our Chamber has testified to the challenges of owning a small business and operating it profitably. In its most recent survey, the Small Business and Entrepreneurship Council's 2009 Annual Survival Guide ranked New Jersey **last**; that is, our state has the

least friendly environment for entrepreneurship. Additionally, The Tax Foundation's 2010 Business Tax Climate Index ranked New Jersey **last** in terms of the cost that our tax system places on entrepreneurs and small businesses. These two studies reflect the cost of doing business and other challenges to operating a profitable small business in New Jersey.

With small business accounting for a large percentage of the economic landscape, it is essential that state agencies explore alternative regulatory approaches in order to minimize the economic impact of rule and regulations on small businesses, while still satisfying the regulatory objective.

ability to use accumulated sick leave in the last year of employment without verification by a physician. It also ends the practice of cashing out unused vacation time to that which is carried forward for one year.

The costs associated with providing limitless payouts for unused sick and vacation time are significant, and are funded by taxpayers whose own benefits (if they are employed) are much more limited. Maintaining these benefits in today's economic climate is no longer an option. Business and property tax payers simply cannot afford to continue to fund these and other generous public employee benefits.

The bill was released the Senate by a vote of 34-0. [Click here](#) to view the Chamber's full testimony on **S-2220 (Sarlo)**.

The Chamber also supported **S-1998 (Ruiz) & S-2067 (T. Kean)**, which allow state colleges and universities to form a risk

management group and establish joint liability funds to purchase property damage, liability and workers' compensation coverage. These bills are part of a "tool kit" that will empower higher education institutions to have greater control over these costs, which ultimately save money.

Direct management of a self-funded workers compensation program has many other benefits, aside from the ability to contain costs. They include: more predictability over costs through the use of better claims data needed to establish proper reserves; more in-depth loss and hazard information that will be used to create effective, proactive loss prevention or control programs; integrated management of the Sick Leave Injury and workers' compensation program; and better coordination of return-to-work programs and medical cost containment.

Privatizing the administrative and legal functions will also reduce the caseload on the State's Division of

Risk Management personnel, providing them more time to manage the remainder of their cases.

shape. Studies show that simply seeing fitness improvements, such as running a faster mile or lifting more weight than before, can improve your self-esteem and body image.

### **It helps make you feel euphoric**

Yes, "runner's high" really does exist...if you're willing to exercise in high-intensity mode. Try running, biking or swimming as fast as you can for 30-40 seconds and then reducing your speed to a gentle pace for five minutes before sprinting again. Repeat four times.
